

Youth Alternative Program (YAP)

YAP assists multi-risk youth who require support and advocacy to live successfully within their community.

Approach

Serving an average of 50 youth and families per year, YAP provides support services to:

- Increase life skills
- Decrease at-risk behaviours
- Increase natural supports
- Increase self-esteem

Over 85% of youth experienced an increase in their overall well-being and over 80% have improved their personal safety, increased the sustainability of positive results generated by the program, as well as demonstrated increased knowledge of family and community support.

Program Intake

Youth, between the ages of 12 - 24, who have exhausted all other resources available to them. Referrals may come from:

McMan Calgary & Area provides supported accommodation and support services to youth¹ who are currently, or are at risk of, experiencing homelessness.

Approach

Services offered include community-based support in the areas of:

- Housing
- Education and employment
- Life/living skills
- Counseling
- Connection with community, family and natural supports
- Cultural resources and services

Serving over 35 youth per year, over 80% experienced an improvement in life skills, over 75% obtained employment and over 70% improved their knowledge of community resources.

¹Youth must not have child protection intervention.

**Hope Homes
Hope Homes for Aboriginal Youth**

Supports youth, between the ages of 15 - 24, who are experiencing homelessness. The Hope Homes program participates in the Coordinated Access and Assessment system in Calgary.

Hope Homes Rapid Rehousing

Supports youth, between the ages of 15 - 24, who are experiencing homelessness for the first time, or have been homeless less than three months.

This rapid intervention program works with youth to reconnect with family, natural supports and/or return home. This is a short-term, three to six month program. For program intake, call (403) 508-7758.
